Randy's Ramblings

• President's Letter from Randy Bodine •

In 2014, while attending Winter Convention in Michigan City, Indiana, I was standing in the buffet line with National IH President, Bob Buxton. We were discussing how the weather report was calling for heavy snow and many were wondering if they would be able to travel home the next day. During our conversation, Bob said, Randy, I bet the weather would be much milder in Alabama, why doesn't your chapter host a Winter Convention? I said to Bob that actually we were going to host Red Power Round Up in 2018. That is how I got us into this wonderful mess – by opening my big mouth. Bob was pleased to hear that a fresh location was considering hosting RPRU. It wasn't long that news had spread throughout the convention and so many people were excited to hear it was going to Alabama. I left that convention feeling great. There was only one thing left to do – go back to Alabama and convince Chapter #23 that they wanted to host. Fortunately for me, you overwhelmingly said yes! You really got me out of a jam – like covering a check written with no money in the bank. With your show of support, the members of Alabama Chapter #23 have said to the rest of the country and the world "We welcome you to Alabama and Red Power Round Up 2018".

Four years ago in Huron, South Dakota, we began to promote the idea of hosting Red Power Round Up. In June of 2015 in Sedalia, Missouri, we were selected to host this event for 2018. Now, we are SIX MONTHS from Red Power Round Up 2018 actually taking place in Montgomery, Alabama, June 13-16, 2018. You have worked tirelessly over the last three years and there is still much work to be done, but I am convinced that, because of your hard work, RPRU 2018 will be a great success and one of the best in history.

These next six months are going to fly by and we are all going to need to continue to work to reach our goals for RPRU 2018. We will start the year off with a RPRU 2018 committee meeting at Garrett Coliseum on January 13, 2018. The meeting will be from 10:00 am to approximately 2:00 pm. Lunch will be served. All committee chairs need to be present and all committee members are welcome, as well as anyone interested in serving in any area during RPRU. We will send an RSVP email to each committee chair. Please contact your

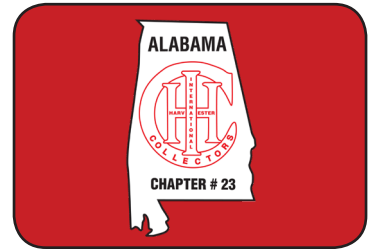

This will be your opportunity to actually visit the site where RPRU 2018 will take place and you can see your area and finalize plans for set up, display, size of area available, etc. We will meet together first as a whole committee, have lunch, then disperse to the individual areas. We are hoping to be far enough along with plans so we won't have to have additional meetings outside of the one with our regular club meeting in April. However, if we aren't as organized or close to finalization as we should be, we will have to schedule other meetings during April, May, or the first week of June.

If you haven't signed up to work during Red Power Round Up 2018, it's not too late. We will need workers from June 9 – June 17. If you're not on a committee, we can find a place for you. You don't have to be available to work the entire time, we will include you for whatever time you can serve. Please email me at randy@bodines.com or call (334) 749-4958.

Over the past three years, there have been days when I think we are way ahead of the curve with our work with RPRU and then other days when I feel like we are behind. Other chapters kept telling me that there is so much that cannot be done until you get closer to the actual event. Well, we are at that point now, and it's time to get everything finalized. The cotton picker toy and belt buckle sales are going well. If you haven't ordered yours, you can get the order forms off of the websites: www.rpru2018.com and www.alabamaih.org or in the latest issue of Harvester Highlights. Also, if you haven't made hotel or camping reservations, you need to get those made quickly as hotels are already beginning to fill up. I wish you could all hear the phone calls and read the emails I get from around the country and the world from people saying how excited they are about RPRU 2018 in Alabama. They all say they "can't wait", "already have my room booked", "can't get here fast enough", "can't wait to see cotton, etc". It is very encouraging to know that the work we are putting in will be time well spent.

During the middle of December, large parts of Alabama had upwards of 12" of snow and much of the North and Midwest had not had any snow. You never know

The meeting was called to order by president Randy Bodine and he began the meeting with an invocation.

The first agenda item was Clay's report. He had no additions to the minutes as published in the recent newsletter and said that the chapter balance is currently \$12,937.44.

He reported that membership currently stands at 317. Since the newsletter went to the printer, six new members have joined the club and are included in the total. This number represents the most active members our chapter has ever had at one time.

He also offered an update on 2018 dues collection. Three weeks after dues notices went out, we have received 170 renewals and taken in \$4110.

He said that he plans to forward our first national dues payment to the national membership secretary shortly after the due date of November 1. We have until the end of January to send in our final payment and updated member roster.

He concluded his report with the news that Jane Bottoms, wife of deceased member, Edward Bottoms, has decided to take over Edward's membership in Chapter #23 and, as is the usual custom, she will assume his member number, #432.

There was a motion and second to accept the minutes and report and the motion passed.

Robert Bodine then reported on what is going on with the FFA restoration project at Asbury High School. He said that they have started working out a plan for weekly work sessions. They have started disassembly

and Guntersville Technical School has agreed to sand-blast and paint the tractor for the FFA.

The next agenda item was to select the locations for our four meetings in 2018. Randy explained that he had given this schedule a lot of thought and proposed the following sites and dates: Montevallo FFA on April 7; Montgomery (Red Power Round Up) on June 16; Fyffe on August 25; and St. Florian on October 6. With these choices, he followed our recent strategy of moving these locations around the state in support of members who live nearby. He also spread the dates through the show season to allow the interval needed to produce a newsletter just before each meeting. And, an important reason to choose the Montevallo FFA show is that we can use a classroom at the high school for one of the final Red Power Round Up meetings only two months before the show.

There was a motion to accept the meeting schedule, and with a second, the motion passed.

Randy then moved on to the selection of three new directors to replace Charles Allen, Conrad Bell, and Wiley Johnson, whose terms expire on Dec. 31, 2017. He asked if there were any nominations for new directors. Robert Bodine nominated Joe Criswell and said that he is willing to serve; Conrad Bell nominated Donnie Wedgworth who was present and said that he is willing to serve; and Gary Bell nominated Clay Nordan who was present and said that he was willing to serve.

Following these nominations, Randy closed nominations and called for a motion to accept the three nominees. He got a motion and second and the motion passed. These new directors will serve three year terms that expire at the end of December 2020.

Next, Randy expressed a need for anyone with new show schedule information to make any needed updates to the master sheet that is on the chapter table today. He then went around the circle and asked anyone with a show to promote to speak up. Among shows promoted by attending members were: Orrville on Nov. 11; Southland Flywheelers next Saturday and the third weekend in March of 2018; Greenville next Saturday; and the Alabama National Fair, Oct. 27-Nov. 5.

Randy then gave a summary of major state and national IH events coming up in the next two years. The closest are the 2018 Winter Convention in Branson, MO, March 8-10 and 2018 Red Power Round Up and Alabama IH

State Show in Montgomery, June 13-16.

To conclude the meeting, Randy announced that bids for the 2020 Alabama IH State Show will close at the end of today's meeting. So far we have only one bid, so if that show is the only bid we get, they will be announced as the host in a future newsletter. If another bid comes in, we will conduct an election by mail.

With no further business to discuss, the meeting was adjourned.

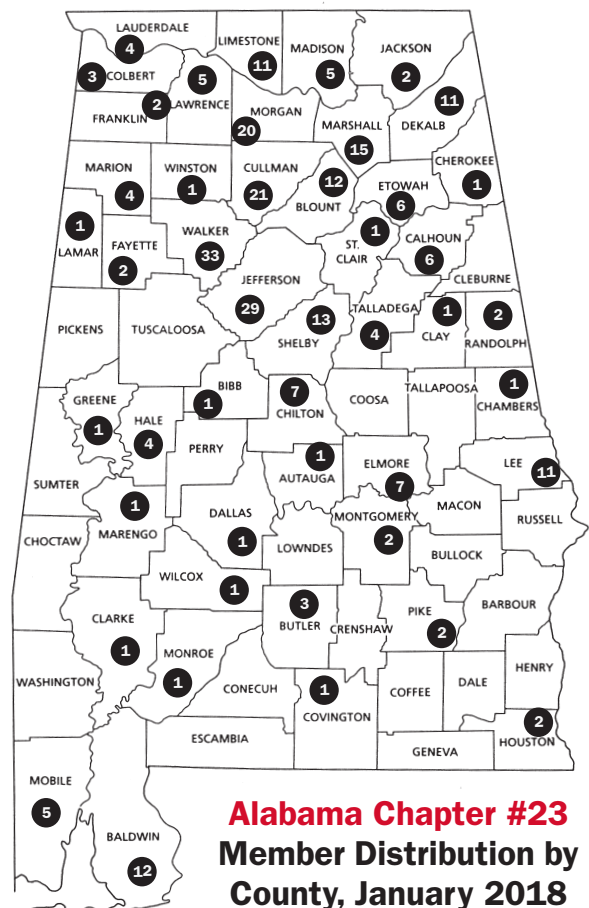
