

President's Letter from Randy Bodine

Well, it's finally here! It's tractor show season again. We are looking forward to many great tractor show events for 2015. You should have recently received your 2015 show schedule with your membership cards. There are some new shows that have been added to the schedule and some shows that have changed their dates. For example, Dothan and Greenville will no longer be on the same weekend as in past years and, just for 2015, Hanceville has moved to May 30 so it will not conflict with the Red Power Round Up. Also, Jeans on the River has moved so it will not conflict with other shows. Please take a close look at this year's schedule. We always say, "call before you haul", just in case.

The membership voted that the show at Moulton will host the 2017 Alabama IH State Show. This means we are set for the next three years (four if we are awarded RPRU 2018). Russellville will be the site for the 2015 Alabama IH State Show and the 2016 show will be at Piney Chapel near Athens, AL.

We are looking forward to Red Power Roundup 2015 to be held in Sedalia, Missouri. Chapter #23 will be taking a bus trip similar to last year's trip to South Dakota for RPRU. However, because Sedalia is much closer, this trip will not be as long and the cost will be less. Be sure to see the flyer on page 11 of this newsletter for more details. Act fast – we think it will fill up quickly and there are only a limited number of hotel rooms and seats on the bus. Please don't delay in responding.

Jana and I have just returned from the IHC Winter Convention in Michigan City, Indiana where we have been busy promoting the possibility of hosting Red Power Roundup 2018 in Montgomery, Alabama. We submitted our proposal to host this event to the National IHC Committee in February and look forward to hearing from them regarding the voting that will take place in Sedalia, Missouri. We will need as many members as possible to be at RPRU 2015 to help promote hosting RPRU 2018 in the great state of Alabama

Our membership base continues to grow. Right now it stands at 263. Let's surpass the 300 member mark this year! 

The meeting was called to order by president Randy Bodine and he began the meeting with an invocation. A sign-up sheet was sent around with a request that email addresses also be listed.

The first agenda item was Clay's report. He had no additions to the minutes as published in the recent newsletter and said that the chapter balance is currently \$19,820. He reported that our membership currently stands at 280 including 4 new members who joined today. He said that 2015 dues collection notices will go in the mail on Monday, November 10, along with a ballot for members to use to vote on the state show host for 2017.

The next agenda item was the selection of four Chapter meeting sites for 2015. Since we always conduct a meeting at the state show, the schedule suggested by Randy was constructed around this already set date and location, which will be Russellville on August 15. To get a good calendar and location spread throughout the

show season, Randy proposed the first meeting for Hartselle on March 21, the second meeting for Elmore on May 16, Russellville for the third site, and then Shelby Ironworks on October 10 for the final meeting of the year. There was a motion from the floor to approve this schedule as presented. There was a second and the motion passed without objection.

The next agenda item was the selection of three new directors to replace the three current directors whose terms expire on December 31, 2014. The current directors, Joe Criswell, Hal Hoaglin, and Sherman Roberts will automatically transition to one year terms as Advisors.

Randy then called for nominations of members to fill these vacancies. Nominations came from the floor for Charles Allen, Conrad Bell, and Wiley Johnson. Randy asked each nominator if they had checked with the member they were nominating to confirm that they are willing to serve if elected. All said that they had and all had agreed to serve. A motion then came from the floor to approve the three nominees. There was a second, and the motion was approved without objection.

The next order of business was for Randy to announce that bids for host of our 2017 State Show are now closed. He said that we have received bids from two shows, Boaz and Moulton. An election by the membership using the ballots to be sent out next week will determine the host. To be counted, ballots must be returned by December 31, 2014. The winner will be announced in the early Spring of 2015. The next agenda item was to let everyone know that the show schedule for 2015 is being finalized. Randy asked that any updates or corrections be made to his schedule sheet today if possible.

Randy then moved on to ask if anyone present wanted to plug an upcoming show.

He reminded everyone that chapter logo shirts and jackets are available and that order forms are available for special orders.

To conclude the meeting, Randy went down the list of major upcoming IH events. They were:

• IH Winter Convention, Michigan City, IN March 5-7, 2015.

• Red Power Roundup 2015 in Sedalia, MO, june 10-13.

• Alabama State IH Show for 2015 in Russellville, AL on August 15, 2015

• Red Power Roundup 2016 will be in Union Grove, Wisconsin, june 16-18, 2016.

• Alabama State Show for 2016 at Piney Chapel near Athens on August 5-6, 2016.

• Red Power Roundup for 2017 will be in Des Moines, IA, june 14-17, 2017.

• If things go our way: Red Power Roundup 2018, Montgomery, AL. The potential date is June 13-16, 2018.


With no further business to discuss, the meeting was adjourned.




This "Join Here Today" poster was used for the first time at the Orrville show to attract attention near the chapter tent. It produced applications and \$25 dues from 4 new members.



# Member Profile

Wiley Johnson grew up on a farm near Abbeville, GA and, with the help of a supportive FFA advisor, he began working at the International Harvester Farm Equipment Training Center near Tifton, GA in the summer right out of high school.

Starting in 1961, International Harvester would send employees and representatives from all over the United States and often from other countries to the Training Center in Tifton and have them attend classes that familiarized them with the IH products they sold and maintained back home as well as products made and sold by IH competitors.

Wiley started out at Tifton in 1963 as an apprentice mechanic, which he says meant that he was a "go-fer" for the more experienced mechanics. His job was to repair anything that needed to be fixed on the demonstration equipment as well as setting up and breaking down the tractor implements and attachments used in the training classes.

After working for a little more than a year, Wiley enrolled at ABAC, a local two-year agriculture college and started work on a degree in Ag Technology. He continued to work almost full-time at the IH Center while in school.

In late '64 or early '65, IH changed Wiley's employee classification to "Journeyman Mechanic" and he continued in this work until the fall of 1969 when he was appointed "Service Manager" for the IH Training Center.

In 1976, IH closed the Training Center in Tifton and moved the operation to Ottawa, Illinois, where it became the Resource Development Center as part of IH's test farm, Industrial Training Center, and Photographic Center.

Wiley left Tifton and moved to Illinois. He continued in mechanical work as an Assistant Service Manager where his department was responsible for keeping equipment repaired and cleaned up.

He was there for two years until he moved back south to Huntsville, AL where he worked as a "Service Traveler", calling on about 30 dealers in the Atlanta Region. It wasn't long before he was relocated to an office in Montgomery, AL where he covered just the state of Alabama.

This office remained open for only a few years, closing in 1983 just ahead of the Tenneco – CASE/IH merger in 1985. In the last couple of years of IH, Wiley continued as a Ser

continued as a Service Traveler and covered the areas of Alabama, South Mississippi, and parts of Georgia.

As a Service Traveler for IH, Wiley was responsible for keeping track of specific problems that had been seen on new pieces of equipment and made his dealers aware to keep an eye out for them in their service operations. He managed and distributed service bulletins to the dealers and also kept them up to date on recalls and other types of service related information. He also made sure that dealers' service technicians received periodic re-training.

In essence, Wiley was the IH point person for each of his dealerships. When a new product came out, he made weekly calls to find out if the dealers experienced any problems that the company needed to know about and to offer remedies that could be handled locally.

He would often go to the field to investigate an equipment failure and see for himself the problem at hand. If he couldn't identify the source or reason for a problem, Wiley had North American Service Managers devoted to specific types of equipment that he could call for help.

Following the 1985 merger, Wiley was retained in Service by the new CASE/IH organization and they kept him in Montgomery. Wiley worked out of his home until 1997 when his territory was divided up between two other employees and he was

appointed as a "Product Specialist".

Wiley became the planter and cotton picker specialist for the area from South Georgia to Columbus, Mississippi and would set up meetings for anyone who wanted a demonstration of how these machines operated. He had an electric powered mock-up planter unit as well as a cotton picker drum that he would send to the demonstration location that could show the equipment in action.

Wiley continued in this "Specialist" role until 2006 when a consolidation in the company offered him the opportunity to retire, which he accepted. But he wasn't completely done. For the next four years the company brought him back under contract each fall to work the cotton harvest on new cotton pickers. He cut the cord for good in the fall of 2010.

With retirement, Wiley and his wife Patricia moved from Montgomery to Wetumpka where they currently live so they can be close to their children and grandchildren.

For the last four or five years Wiley has stayed busy in the summer mowing  $6\frac{1}{2}$  acres of soccer fields on the north edge of Montgomery. He uses an IH Cub 154 Lo-Boy to do this mowing, which he says still does a good job.

Wiley has a total of 6 tractors, all IH with the exception of a CASE 400. He brings most of them to the show at Elmore each May.


