The meeting was called to order by president Randy Bodine and he began the meeting with an invocation.

The first agenda item was Clay's report. He had no additions to the minutes as published in the recent newsletter and said that the chapter balance is currently \$17,480.17. He also reported that membership currently stands at 279 and that some new members were expected to join today.

Clay also reported that dues collection will start a month earlier this year than in the past due to the fact that the national membership secretary has notified us that our dues payment for 2017 is payable on November 1, 2016. Dues notices will go into the mail around October 1, so members need to take advantage of the self-addressedstamped envelope that will be provided and get their checks into the mail as soon as possible. Randy reiterated that dues collection should not take months and asked that all members send in their checks just as soon as they get the notice.

Randy called for a motion to accept the minutes and Clay's report. There was a motion, second, and the motion was approved.

The first item on the agenda was a reminder that all expenditures related to the 2018 Red Power Round Up must be pre-approved by the show chairman (Randy), the vice-chairman (Gary Bell), or the financial chair (Jana Bodine).

Next, Randy stated that the logo for

the 2018 RPRU has been finalized and that a nice example was printed in the recent newsletter for everyone to see.

The next agenda item was a reminder that we are still looking for a member to head up the RPRU Merchandising Committee. Randy asked that any members who feel qualified to take on this important position please step forward and let it be known that they are interested in this important leadership role.

Next on the agenda, Randy encouraged any members present to offer any thoughts or observations about what they saw and learned at this year's RPRU in Wisconsin. There was some good discussion about what worked and what did not work. And Randy used Clay's recent written report on his experience with show book photography at Union Grove as an example of how committee chairmen can communicate preparation and progress in their respective areas of responsibility.

Randy encouraged all committees to keep thinking about what needs to be done to make our show the success we are hoping for, and he asked that any ideas be sent to him via email. He said that we have a running list that we started several years ago of ideas for RPRU 2018 and we need to build on those ideas to have a successful show.

Next on the agenda was a lively discussion about options for RPRU parades. Nothing was resolved, but all issues and concerns related to parades were put on the table for later consideration.

The next agenda item was a reminder about the Winter Convention scheduled for March 2-4, 2017 at Columbus, IN. Randy encouraged everyone to attend this important event and be willing to work the chapter table, hand out information, and sign-up vendors.

In conjunction with Randy announcement then transitioned to the 2017 Red Power Round Up to be held at Des Moines, Iowa, June 14-17, 2017. He made it clear that this will be our most important event other than the 2018 RPRU itself. Everyone there will be making plans for the next RPRU and that will be 2018. He said that we will need ALL HANDS ON DECK in Iowa next summer.

The next agenda item was a request that if a member knows of anyone who might be willing to help sponsor RPRU 2018 to let Randy know. This is an important facet of putting on the show and we need to get these sponsors lined up as soon as we can.

The next item was a reminder that

our final meeting of the year will be at the Greenville Show on October 29. Greenville is on I-65 about an hour south of Montgomery in Butler County. This will be the first time we have met at this show, so everyone is encouraged to come enjoy this new tractor show venue.

Also, following the meeting at Greenville, we will adjourn Montgomery and the grounds of Garrett Coliseum for a Red Power Round Up meeting. The Alabama National Fair will be underway at that time, so we will get an ideal demonstration of how the Garrett facility measures up for a big event that should attract a large number of visitors over a weekend.

Randy asked that if any members can't make it to Greenville, they should try to join us for the meeting at Garrett that afternoon. He said that this will be a very important meeting as we tour the grounds and finalize some logistical plans. This is especially important for members who have never been to the show grounds.

He also mentioned that he intends to schedule a Red Power Roundup meeting for some time in the winter (Dec/Jan). The location will probably be somewhere in north Alabama and the date and time will be announced later.

The final items on the agenda included an announcement that RPRU show toy negotiations are still underway, and that the feature tractor for 2018 will be "Offset" tractors (Cub, Cub Lo-Boy, A, Super A, B, 100, 130, 140 and IH 274). Also, the website, www.rpru2018.com and the FaceBook page should be up and running soon.

Randy encouraged everyone to stick around and come back to the tent for our designated Red Power Round Up meeting at 1:00 pm today.

The meeting came to a close with Randy going around the circle and recognizing anyone with a show to plug. The shows promoted by members were: Jeans on the River, Orrville, Hartselle Depot Days, St. Florian, East Alabama (Wedowee), Southland Flywheelers, and Fyffe UFO Days.

With no further business to discuss. the meeting was adjourned.








Map to Garrett Coliseum – Montgomery, Alabama








# LET'S BRING AGRICULTURE HERITAGE BACK TO THE STATE FAIR!

# Carl's Cut-Away 2N Ford

The Ford 9N, 2N, and 8N series of tractors, based on the innovative three-point hitch implement connection system invented by Harry Ferguson has been popular with Alabama farmers since its introduction in 1939. Carl Pletcher (#471) of Altoona in Etowah County displayed his recently completed "cut-away" model 2N at the show at Snead in April and got lots of compliments for the clear, easy to understand methods he employed to show the inner workings of the famous machine.

Carl came up with a clever scheme of color coding that identifies the various mechanisms and systems that are essential to the operation of

the tractor. It sits on a good looking custom built trailer that Carl can move around a show grounds with a four-wheel drive golf cart. A sign
