President's Letter from Randy Bodine

I want to encourage all of our members to attend at least one new show that you have never attended. One of my first new shows for this year was the Strawberry Festival held in Loxley. There were about 100,000 people who attended this three-day event so it was certainly a great venue to display a tractor. Be sure to check out the show schedule, load up a tractor, and visit someplace new.

Our first quarter club meeting of the year was held in Snead, Alabama, at Snead Equipment, the Case/IH dealership owned by Joe Criswell. We appreciate Joe hosting our chapter meeting and we had a perfect day for the event. We even made history on that Saturday! I have been informed by Clay Nordan that this is the first meeting ever with perfect attendance by the entire leadership. All the officers, directors, and advisors were present. I want to thank everyone for the extra effort and hope you keep up the good work. It is very encouraging to me that the enthusiasm of the club is at an all-time high with our efforts to host Red Power Round Up 2018. Other collector organizations do the same thing. They host Mustang-only shows, or Harley-Davidson-only motorcycle shows, or Corvette-only shows, etc. So, you can display anything IH at RPRU if you have it, or you're welcome to attend as a spectator. Better yet, if you don't have anything IH, you have over two years to acquire something to display at the show. Also know that "barnfresh" and "working clothes" displays are welcome. Sometimes these are the ones that get the most attention – a good original.


I also want to mention that you need to be a member of the National IHC in order to display at RPRU. This is true for all RPRU's, including Union Grove, WI, coming up in June, Des Moines, IA, next year and in Montgomery, Alabama. If you are a member of Chapter #23, you are already a member of the National IHC. You don't have to do anything else. Each November when you pay your \$25 dues, \$15 of that goes for your national membership and \$10 stays with Chapter #23. If you are getting this newsletter, you are in good standing with Chapter #23 and therefore, you also receive your "Harvester Highlights" from the national organization because you are in good standing with them.

Please encourage everyone you know that may want to display at RPRU to join Chapter #23 today and avoid the rush. If you are like me, and are a member of other local tractor clubs, please encourage your members who may not be part of Chapter #23 to join. We would welcome them as members and would love to have them display at RPRU 2018 and join us as we make this the best RPRU ever.

The meeting was called to order by president Randy Bodine and he began the meeting with an invocation.

The first agenda item was Clay's report. He had no additions to the minutes as published in the recent newsletter and said that the chapter balance is currently \$19,531.08. He reported that our membership had increased by 2 to 261 since the publication of the recent newsletter, but one additional renewal had been received today and several new members should join before today's show ends.

Randy called for a motion to approve the minutes. There was a motion, second, and approval of the minutes as printed in the newsletter.

The next item on the agenda was a report on this year's Winter Convention given by Vice-President, Gary Bell.

(Read the text of Gary's report on page 8 of this newsletter.)

Randy then moved on to discuss the bus trip to this year's Red Power Roundup in Wisconsin. He said that as of today he could probably take a few more passengers, but he will have to cut it off in the next couple of days. he reminded everyone that this year's trip will be more than just transportation to and from the big IH show. It also includes tours of the Racine CASE/IH tractor plant as well as the Hindsdale/ BurrRidge proving grounds and a Navistar truck plant that is on the bus route.

The next agenda item was to recognize the three new directors whose terms began on January 1 of this year. Randy welcomed Buck Brown, Charlie Grimmitt, and Dean Higgins to their first meeting as directors. He also thanked Gary Bell, Brad Bodine, and Larry Lemmond for their service the past three years. At the conclusion of their terms, all three former directors were automatically appointed as Advisors for one year.

The agenda then called for an overview of the locations for our remaining three meetings for the year. Our second meeting will be at Hanceville on June 11. The third meeting will be in conjunction with the state show at Piney Chapel on August 6, and the final meeting will be at Greenville, south of Montgomery, which is a new show for most of us.

Randy mentioned that the Piney Chapel show has told him that they are interested in selecting a feature tractor each year now that they have a second field available for display. They are hoping to fill that field up with red tractors this year, so we need a good turnout of IH products for this year's state show.

Randy also announced that following the meeting at Greenville at 11:00 a.m. on October 29, he has scheduled a Red Power Roundup 2018 committee meeting for that afternoon back in Montgomery at Garrett Coliseum. He said that the Alabama National Fair will be going on at that time, so we'll also get an opportunity to inspect the RPRU site while a big event is in progress.

Next on the agenda was an update of the 2016 show schedule. Randy said that the show at Hackleburg had been cancelled and that the date for the Summerdale show has been moved to May 21. In addition, the south Georgia show at Lake Park, put on by one of our members, Vernon Culpepper and his family, was not included on our pocket schedule, but it is a show worth going to and will be on October 22.

Randy also said that he has show

schedule posters, flyers, and cards available for posting in feed stores, repair shops, and tractor dealerships, etc. and encouraged everyone at the meeting to take some and get them distributed.

The next agenda item called for plugs from anyone with an upcoming show to promote. Among the shows getting mentions were: Elmore, Shoals/ St. Florian, Hanceville, Winterboro, Fyffe, Point Mallard, Boaz, and Montevallo FFA.

Randy then called on Joe Criswell, one of our directors and the owner of Snead Equipment, the site of today's tractor show and Chapter #23 meeting. Joe welcomed everyone and said that he appreciated the good turnout today. He said that he was thankful that the weather cooperated and gave us a nice day this year for a change.

At the conclusion of Joe's remarks, he awarded Harold Beck a plaque for having the oldest running tractor at the show, his 1940 Farmall H.

Randy then announced that he has decided to conduct a meeting devoted to Red Power Roundup 2018 at 1:00 p.m. following each of our regularly scheduled chapter meetings during this year's show season. He said that the first of these extra meetings would be held today, so he encouraged everyone to get some lunch, courtesy of Joe Criswell, after we adjourn, and then re-convene at 1:00 to discuss where we stand on RPRU planning.

The meeting ended with Randy going over the dates and locations for the next several years of upcoming state and national events and shows.

He also spoke about a lesson we learned from the Tennessee chapter this year regarding the selection of host shows for state shows. It turns out that Tennessee will hold their state show this year at exactly the same time, the weekend of June 18, as the national Red Power Roundup. This happened because they selected their 2016 host before the national club had set a date for this year's national show.

We have already selected Boaz for our 2019 show, but the national club will not have a host and date for 2019 until the conclusion of this year's RPRU. Randy recommended that we take a pause in our state show bid process and not solicit bids for 2020 until we know the date for that year's RPRU.

With no further business to discuss, the meeting was adjourned.




