The meeting was called to order by president Randy Bodine and he began the meeting with an invocation. A sign-up sheet was sent around with a request that email addresses also be listed.

The first agenda item was Clay's report. He had no additions to the minutes as published in the recent newsletter and said that the chapter balance is currently \$21,981.93. He reported that our membership currently stands at 255.

Next on the agenda, Randy brought everyone up to date on the conclusion of last year's successful fundraiser and reported that the Christmas party and fundraiser drawing was a huge success. The final amount raised by the fundraiser was \$22,160.

Randy announced that he had started another smaller fundraiser. It involves collecting \$1.00 donations to win the newly published book *Red Tractors* by Octane Press. The book winner will be announced at the Eva show on September 27.

Randy then reported that the Birmingham Zoo Farm Day on April 12 was successful again this year. There was good participation by Chapter #23 members and 4357 visitors spent a beautiful spring day at the Zoo. Randy said that pictures from Farm Day are now up on the chapter website.

The next agenda item was an update

on the bus tour to the Red Power Roundup in Huron, SD in June. Randy said that the bus is currently only half full and that more paying passengers are needed. He said that the trip is open to anyone who wants to go but doesn't look forward to a very long drive.

The next agenda item was to announce that the directors have made the commitment to seek the Red Power Roundup for 2018 for the Garrett Coliseum grounds in Montgomery. The proposed dates are June 14-16, 2018. Randy said that he has already spoken to the Coliseum as well as state tourism officials, and he received enthusiastic

support from both groups.

Randy said that he and other directors who are present will make a big push for the idea at the South Dakota RPRU, but the formal presentation will be made in 2015 at the Sedalia, MO roundup. No other state chapters will be asked to partner with us on this event. Randy said that we will need good attendance for the Missouri presentation to show the level of our commitment to the project. The most positive aspect of this idea is that the long lead time will make the preparation a long process and that good planning and involvement of the membership will make for a great

Randy has heard for years that the more northern chapters have an interest in Cotton growing and harvesting and the IH equipment used in the process, so Cotton culture will be our main theme for the show.

Next on the agenda was a rundown of upcoming shows of interest. In addition to the South Dakota RPRU, June 26-28, 2014, the Alabama State IH Show for 2014 is scheduled for Eva on Septembe 27. The Red Power Roundup for 2015 will be at Sedalia, MO, June 10-13. The Alabama State IH Show for 2015 will be held at Russellville, August 15. The Red Power Roundup for 2016 will be held in Union Grove, Wisconsin, June 16-18. The Alabama State IH Show for 2016 will be held at Piney Chapel, August 5-6. And bids for the Alabama State show for 2017 are open and will remain available until our meeting at Orrville on November 8, 2014. It was also announced that the Hanceville show in 2015 will move to the last Saturday in May for that year only.

Our next meeting will be at Boaz on July 19, 2014 and the third meeting of the year will be at the State Show at Eva on September 27.

Three new directors, who took office on January 1, 2014 were welcomed at the meeting today. They are: Roger Heath, Clay Nordan, and Donnie Wedgworth. Randy thanked the three directors whose terms expired on December 31, 2013: Charles Allen, Conrad Bell, and Dwight Vanderford. All three of these former directors will serve for one year as advisors.

Randy then handed the microphone to Joe Criswell, member #357. Joe welcomed everyone to his dealership today and said that he was pleased to have a warm, dry day for us for a change. He said that our presence at his annual show contributes to its success and he thanked us for coming.

Randy then explained that the sound system in use today was new and recently purchased by the chapter with some of our fundraiser funds. The directors approved the purchase a few weeks back so that we would have it in time for today's meeting. It was very effective in overpowering the John Deere tractors and loud motorcycles that went by during the meeting. Everyone in attendance would agree that it was money well spent and will pay for itself in similar circumstances down the road.

As the meeting came to a close, Sherman Roberts spoke up to request a serious commitment from every Chapter #23 member as we undertake the Red Power Roundup project. He said that just a few members working hard will not be enough to make for a show that our visitors will enjoy and remember. Everyone needs to pitch in and do whatever is requested of them and make our chapter and state proud to be hosting this ambitious show.

With no further business to discuss, the meeting was adjourned.





At the big tractor show at Rantoul, Illinois in the summer of 2013, Chapter #23 president Randy Bodine spotted an old Weber Wagon in original condition. Later that same year, it came to my attention that a similar wagon was available for sale on an online auction in the Mid-West. It eventually sold for \$3300.

I knew nothing about Weber Wagons before seeing these two nice examples, but when I saw the Weber logo that was on both wagons, I thought of my good friend, Chris Green, who lives in Lebanon, NJ. Since his retirement, Chris has become quite adept at using computer software to recreate old "logotypes" that are no longer available. I sent him photos of the two Weber logos, and you can see the incredible results of his labors above.

Due to the faded nature of the photos we had available, Chris had to do some guessing about his color choices, but the results certainly speak for themselves.

I have since learned that the Weber Wagon Company of Chicago was established in 1845. In 1904, it was purchased by International Harvester Co. Weber was called "King of All Farm Wagons" and had a wide reputation for quality.

At this year's tractor show at Snead, AL Randy and I met Donnie Speer, of Glencoe in Etowah County, who had brought his recently completed wagon restoration to the show that day. All Donnie knew about the wagon was that it had been driven to Etowah County in the early 1900's by someone who migrated to Alabama from Kansas.

Randy examined the wagon very closely and came to the conclusion that Donnie's restoration was indeed a Weber.

Donnie told us that he was able to use most of the metal hardware that remained from the original wagon, but he rebuilt all of the wooden components of the wagon.

Some of the wood undercarriage and axles were too big a challenge for Donnie, so he was able to locate an Amish wagon builder in Tennessee who fabricated some of the heavier parts.

I told Donnie about the recreated Weber logo that I had available and later sent him a computer file of the graphic for him to use on his wagon. Donnie has since become a member of Chapter #23, so we hope to see him again at future shows with his wagon and Weber logo in place. Clay Nordan




